## Research and submission guidelines

Thank you for your interesting in submitting your work to Team Populism's Leader Profile Series! The purpose of the series is to generate a repository of descriptions of the populism of local and national political leaders that engage with the ideational approach to populism.

To achieve a successful leader profile, please follow these guidelines:

- Please limit your work to 4,000 words.
- Submissions must engage with the ideational approach, and while submissions are not required to draw from holistic grading or survey item inventories designed by members of Team Populism, they should demonstrate familiarity with these techniques. Indicators of populism from other traditions are also welcome but only in addition. For more information and training on the methodology, please [click here](#). (guest key: "polworkshop20")
- Your quantitative analysis should be accompanied by a qualitative analysis section where you can deepen on the specific themes of the leader's rhetoric.
- Please include the completed rubrics and a copy of each speech in an appendix at the end of your profile.
- If accepted, you will be required to format your work and citations in Turabian/Chicago Author-Date style. You can see example papers [clicking here](#).

Once you feel your Leader Profile is ready, please send it as an anonymized Word (.doc or .docx) document to our email, [TeamPopulism@byu.edu](mailto:TeamPopulism@byu.edu). Confirmation that your paper has been received will be sent to you within 48 business hours.

Once the leader profile has been received, it will be assigned to at least two anonymous reviewers who will decide to accept it as is, propose changes, or

reject the profile. If changes are proposed by the editors, a copy of their comments will be returned to you through email. You are expected to address each proposed change and add a cover sheet to your revised paper with a response on how that was done before resubmitting the paper. Once a paper has been resubmitted and/or accepted, it will be published and made available on [TeamPopulism.com](http://TeamPopulism.com)
